Come, you who have much faith and you who have little, and you who have not been for a long time, you who have been here often, you who have tried to follow and you who feel you have failed.

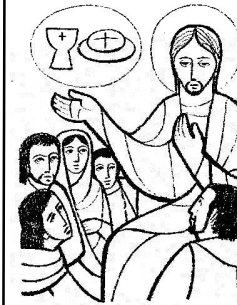
Come, not because I invite you, but because God does; and, as you are welcomed, go, and welcome others.

Corpus Christi

Corpus Christi (Latin for Body of Christ) is a Christian feast in honour of the Holy Eucharist. It was originally assigned to the Thursday following Trinity Sunday, thereby mirroring Holy (Maundy) Thursday, the Thursday of Holy Week, the day on which we commemorate The Last Supper of Jesus Christ and his apostles, seen as the first Holy Eucharist.



This year we are celebrating this Feast of Corpus Christi on the Sunday after Trinity Sunday because of the Confirmation service on Thursday.

The appearance of Corpus Christi as a feast in the Christian calendar was primarily due to the petitions of the thirteenth-century Augustinian Juliana of Liège. From her youth she claimed that God had been instructing her to establish a feast day for the Eucharist.
